After having reached the ripe old age of 83 years, 5 months and 20 days, and having lived a lifetime in Clinton county, Ann Eliza Deise, a well known woman of Dunnstable township, was stricken with apoplexy late Thursday afternoon and was found dead in her bed about 6 o'clock at the home of her brother, J. M. Deise, Dunnstable township, when Mrs. Deise went upstairs to call her for supper.

The aged woman had been complaining for about a week, but on Thursday she seemed somewhat better and was about the house and in the yard as late as 2.30 o'clock that afternoon, when she retired to her room to rest. Apparently she had been dead but a short time when found and evidently her death had been painless and without a struggle.
