

An Old Lady's Treasure.

Lawyer T. M. Stevenson spent last week in Dunnstable township assisting the heirs of the late Christina Deise to settle the estate of the deceased. There are eleven heirs, the youngest of whom is forty-eight years of age, and so amiable and agreeable were they that the settlement of the business was a matter of but a few hours. Among the personal effects of the deceased was \$500 in gold coin and several hundred dollars in silver coin, the treasure being tied up in a red bandana handkerchief. The coins were of issues bearing dates from 1811 to 1870, and among them was a fifty dollar gold piece six sided, instead of being round. One silver piece is dated 1811. The coin was the savings of many years, and for safe keeping was hid away in a corner of a stone chimney.

Death of Mrs. Deise.

Mrs. Christena Deise, widow of the late Andrew Deise, died Thursday night at her home in Dunnstable township, at the advanced age of 89 years and 4 months. Her husband, Andrew Deise, died Nov. 18, 1884, aged 86 years. Mrs. Deise was the mother of Mrs. McCurdy, Mrs. Jacob Gets, and of John and George Deise.
