

STRICKEN WITH APOPLEXY

“Uncle Jake” Dice Expires Last Tuesday Night.

Mr. Jacob Dice, of Wayne township, was stricken on Monday morning about 2 o'clock with apoplexy and laid in a critical condition until Tuesday night at 7 o'clock when he breathed his last. Mr. Dice was the last heir living of the old Dice family, he being 81 years, 10 months and 15 days old. He was a man everybody knew by the name of “Uncle Jake.” He built the depot at Wayne station for the P. and E. railroad company and was agent for 27 years for said company. He also established the McElhattan post office at Rock Hill, in Wayne, under James Buchanan's administration and was post master eight years. Since that time he has spent a private life. He leaves one son, H. B. Dice, assistant agent at Jersey Shore station. Funeral to-day at 2 o'clock. Services at Union church, upper Wayne, by Revs. Basom, of Lock Haven and Wilhelm, of Mill Hall.
