Mrs. Frances Deise McCurdy, of Dunnstable township, passed away Tuesday evening of last week after a short illness, aged 85 years. Mrs. McCurdy was the daughter of the late Andrew Deise, her father being one of the earlier settlers in Dunnstable township.

Mrs. McCurdy was a most estimable woman. The greater part of her life was spent in the township where she was born. She was a noble and good woman that endeared herself to everyone that became in any way associated with her. She will be sadly missed by her family and neighbors. She lived the life of a Christian and by her life set an example for others to follow. For one of her age she was quite an active woman, able to be about her household duties up until last Sunday evening. During the night she was stricken suddenly and never regained consciousness, passing away Tuesday evening surrounded at her bedside by all her children except Thomas, of Philadelphia.

Funeral services over the remains were conducted at the family residence, near McElhattan, at 10 o'clock Friday morning by Rev. D. R. Moss, Ph. D., pastor of the Church of Christ. The funeral was largely attended by relatives and friends of the deceased, who was a well known and respected woman.
